What is meant by the term *fellowship* in 2 Corinthians 6:14? Why can there be no fellowship between light and darkness?

What harmony is there between Christ and Belial?

Contrast the person and work of Jesus Christ with the person and work of Satan.

What does the word *harmony* mean? Why is there no harmony between Jesus Christ and Satan?

What does a believer have in common with an unbeliever?

When 2 Corinthians 6:15 refers to believer and unbeliever, what is meant?

How does Ephesians 4:22-24 describe it? What is the fundamental and basic disconnect between believers and unbelievers?

What agreement is there between the temple of God and idols?

What does 2 Corinthians 6:16 tell us about the temple of God?

In vs.16 the word *agreement* means “union”. Why is there no agreement between the temple of God and idols?

What excuses do we use to allow us to be yoked with unbelievers?

Why is “do not be yoked together with unbelievers” so important to God?
