I. Looking to the Past

What does the broken bread of Communion remind us of?
Read Isaiah 53:4-5. What perspective do these verses give on this?

What does taking this bread mean? Why should someone not take the bread or the cup if they have not accepted the sacrifice of Jesus Christ?

What does the cup we take represent? What does Hebrews 9:22 tell us?

II. Looking to the Future

Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. What is proclaimed as we eat the bread and drink the cup? How does this verse look to the future?

Why would the early church find great comfort in this emphasis on the future found in Communion?

Why is the emphasis on the future also important for us today to consider?

III. Looking at the Present

The three KRAs of Grace Baptist Church are:

- Growing in Discipleship
- Being on Mission for God/Biblical Worldview
- Having Significant Relationships with Others

What does Jesus tell us to do in Matthew 28:19-20

How does God's Word form us spiritually as a disciple of Jesus?

What is the evidence of being formed spiritually as a disciple?

How does our discipleship impact us and how does it impact others?

Matthew 28:19 tells us to make disciples as we go. With this in mind, what does it mean for us to *be on mission for God*?

Why is it important to believe that God is already at work in the situations of our lives and with the people of our lives?

How does hearing the story of others give us an opportunity to share about our story and how Jesus has impacted our story?

Consider one or two significant relationships in your life. How has God used these relationships to impact and shape you?
